Ricardo Alban, President of the National Confederation of Industry – CNI

Ricardo Alban holds a bachelor's degree in Mechanical Engineering from the Federal University of Bahia and a degree in Business Administration from the School of Management of Bahia. He assumed the Presidency of CNI on October 31, 2023, for a four-year term. From 2014 to 2023, he served as the President of the Federation of Industries of the State of Bahia (FIEB) and the Center of Industries of the State of Bahia (CIEB). He was the Vice President of CNI from 2018 to 2023. Ricardo Alban is the Chairman of the National Council of the National Service for Industrial Learning (SENAI) and the Superior Council of the Euvaldo Lodi Institute (IEL), as well as a Director of the National Department of the Social Service of Industry (SESI). He is a member of the National Deliberative Council of the Brazilian Micro and Small Business Support Service (Sebrae), the National Council of Fertilizers and Plant Nutrition (Confert), and the National Council for Industrial Development (CNDI). He was an executive at the Citibank group in the 1980s and, since 1987, has been a partner-director of Biscoitos Tupy, a traditional food factory founded by his family.



Eduardo Eugenio Gouvêa Vieira, President of the Federation of Industry of the State of Rio de Janeiro - FIRJAN

Engineer. Eduardo Eugenio began his career at Petrobras Ipiranga in 1968, rising to prominent positions over nearly 40 years. With extensive experience in boards and presidencies, he leads the Brazilian Chemical Industry Association and has chaired ONIP and FIRJAN since 1995. Additionally, he played crucial roles on the boards of various financial and industrial institutions. Currently, he serves as the vice-president of CNI (National Confederation of Industry).









Aloizio Mercadante, President at the Brazilian Development Bank - BNDES

Aloizio Mercadante is currently president of the National Bank for Economic and Social Development (BNDES). He is a professor, academic, economist and politician affiliated with the Workers' Party (PT). He was Minister of Education, of Science, Technology and Innovation and of the Civil House during the Dilma Rousseff government, vice-president of the Workers' Party, as well as senator and federal deputy for São Paulo.



Eduardo Paes, Mayor of Rio de Janeiro

Eduardo Paes holds a bachelor's degree in Law from PUC-Rio University. He has dedicated his career to public service, beginning in 1993 when, at the age of 23, he was appointed Supervisor of the Jacarepaguá and Barra districts. He was twice elected to the City Council and twice to the

Federal Congress. In October 2008, he was elected Mayor of Rio de Janeiro. In 2012, he was reelected in the first round for a second term. As mayor, Mr. Paes oversaw a cycle of great events in Rio de Janeiro, from the Rio+20 Conference in 2012, through the 2014 FIFA World Cup to the 2016 Summer Olympic and Paralympic Games. Between 2017 and 2020, he worked as a consultant in the Urban Planning Department of the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB) and as Vice President for Latin America of BYD Company Ltd., focusing on the management of metropolitan regions. In 2020, he was elected mayor of the city for a third term, taking office on January 1st, 2021. From 2013 to 2016 Mayor Paes served as Chair of the C40 cities Climate Leadership Group, succeeding Mayor Bloomberg of New York City.

In 2023 he joined the Board of the Resilient Cities Network and cochairs the Urban SDG Finance Commission. He is currently the Vicepresident of the Brazilian Conference of Mayors and its Special Envoy for Climate Change.



Cláudio Castro, Governor of the State of Rio de Janeiro

Cláudio Bomfim de Castro e Silva is a Brazilian lawyer and politician affiliated with the Liberal Party and the current governor of Rio de Janeiro. For 12 years he was chief of staff in the Legislative Assembly of the State of Rio de Janeiro. In 2016, he won the election for city councilor of Rio de Janeiro for the Christian Social Party (PSC), where he held office for two years. He also served on the Chamber's Board of Directors, as 2nd Secretary. In October 2018, he became part of the slate of candidates for state government. He was re-elected governor in the first round of the 2022 elections.

Geraldo Alckmin, Vice President of Brazil and Minister of Development, Industry, Trade and Services

Geraldo Alckmin was four times Governor of the State of São Paulo. He was a founder member of the Brazilian Social Democracy Party-PSDB. He left PSDB, after three decades of membership, on December 2021, and joined the Brazilian Socialist Party to integrate Lula's ticket to the Presidency. He is a Doctor and a Professor. He started his political career more than 50 years ago. During this long term, he held many elective offices: municipal Councillor, Mayor of Pindamonhangaba, State and Federal Congressman, Lieutenant-Governor and Governor of the State of São Paulo.



Ian Bremmer, President of the Eurasia Group and GZERO Media (virtual)

Ian Bremmer is a political scientist and the president and founder of Eurasia Group and GZERO Media. Ian is credited with bringing the craft of political risk to financial markets, creating Wall Street's first global political risk index (GPRI), and for establishing political risk as an academic discipline.

Ambassador Mauricio Carvalho Lyrio is the Secretary for Economic and Financial Affairs at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs since April 2023, and has served as Brazil's G20 Sherpa. He is also responsible for overseeing negotiations in multilateral economic organizations such as the WTO and the OECD.

Francisco Gomes Neto was appointed President and CEO of Embraer in May 2019. He has extensive experience in the management of companies in the transportation sector in Brazil and overseas. He holds a degree in Electrical Engineering with a specialization in business administration, as well as an MBA in finance and control. Gomes Neto has 20 years of CEO experience leading companies in Brazil and the United States. Prior to Embraer, he led the Marcopolo group, one of the leading bus manufacturers in the world, in which time he led the company's transformation process, generating strong sales growth and market value for the business. He was also CEO Americas of Mann+Hummel and was the President of Knorr Bremse Brasil, a leading company in commercial vehicle control systems.



Walter Schalka, CEO at Suzano

Walter Schalka is CEO of Suzano, a position he has held since January 2013. The executive has played a strategic role in the evolution of the company's results in recent years, including the combination between Suzano Pulp and Paper and Fibria Celulose, concluded on January 14th, 2019.

He started his career at Citibank and later joined the holding company of Grupo Maepar. In 1989, he began working as Chief Financial Officer at Dixie Lalekla, and later became General Manager and eventually CEO after the merger that created the Dixie Toga Group. In May 2005, he joined Grupo Votorantim as CEO of Votorantim Cimentos. In January 2013, he became CEO of Suzano. Walter holds a bachelor's degree in engineering from the Technological Institute of Aeronautics (ITA) and a graduate degree in Business Administration from the Getulio Vargas Foundation of São Paulo (FGV-SP). He also participated in executive programs at IMD (Switzerland) and Harvard University (USA).

Nominated as Fastmarkets RISI's Latin American CEO of the year -pulp and paper industry - in 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2018, 2020 and 2022, he was elected one of the 15 Best CEOs in Brazil by Forbes in 2018. Walter is 62 years old; he is married, and he has three children, a grandson, and a granddaughter.









Ricardo Mussa, CEO at Raízen

Ricardo Mussa is CEO at Raízen, an integrated energy company committed to sustainability. Graduated in Production Engineering by Escola Politécnica da Universidade de São Paulo, and he has worked for multinationals such as Unilever and Danone.

In 2007, he joined Cosan, as one of the founders and CEO at Radar for 5 years, a company dedicated to investing in agricultural land with high potential for appreciation. In 2014, he assumed as CEO at Moove, the Lubricants business of Cosan, with operations in 6 countries including Europe and Latin America. In 2017, he assumed the executive vice-presidency of Logistics, Distribution & Trading at Raízen. In 2020, he became CEO at Raízen Today he leads a team of 46 thousand people.



Fernando de Rizzo, CEO at Tupy

Fernando Cestari de Rizzo held several leadership positions before becoming CEO of Tupy, leading areas of Engineering, Strategic Planning, Sales and Manufacturing. Being at the company for over 30 years and having experiences in different areas and regions allowed him to know Tupy's entire value chain, from the operation to the customer.

Luciana Ribeiro, Founder eB Capital

Luciana Antonini Ribeiro is a Brazilian investor and a leading voice in climate-related investments. She is a co-founder of eB Capital, a Brazilian investment firm focused on private equity and infrastructure opportunities. She was recognized as one of the 20 Most Powerful Women in Brazil by Forbes magazine and named one of the 100 most innovative women in Brazil by Época Negócios magazine.

For six consecutive years, she has been nominated as one of the leading women investing in Latin America by Lavca (Association for Private Capital Investment in Latin America). Additionally, in 2019, she received the Sabiá Laranjeira Prize from the Sustainable Leadership Platform in recognition of her leadership as an activist.







Luciana is also part of the technical advisory board of the Climate Hub, launched by the Columbia Global Center, in Rio de Janeiro. Luciana is the chairwoman of Brazil Climate Summit (BCS), an initiative of Brazilian business leaders, students, and alumni of Columbia University, and the Columbia Global Center - RJ. The event first edition was held in 2022, at the Columbia University Campus (NY). The BCS became an annual event with a focus on showing the Brazil's key role in the global decarbonization path.

Luciana is a prominent speaker on the agenda of climate investments for the media. She has a Law degree from the Federal University of Rio Grande do Sul (UFRGS), a master's in law by Universidade de Sao Paulo (USP), and an MBA at Columbia Business School.



Claudia Sender, Board Member

Claudia Sender is a member of the Board of Directors of several publicly traded companies and NGOs, such as Telefonica in Spain, Holcim in Switzerland, Gerdau, and Embraer in Brazil. Among the NGOs are highlighted Hospital Israelita Albert Einstein, Amigos do Bem, Gastromotiva, and Ensina Brasil.

She has received numerous awards, including the Women's Leadership award from CEBDS, the HITEC 50 recognition, and the Executivo de Valor award in IT & Telecom. Tania has also been honored by various organizations, such as Women in Tech Brazil, Bloomberg Linea Brasil, Isto É Dinheiro magazine, Educando NGO, the Association of Engineers Brazil-Germany, the Engineering Institute, and EY's Entrepreneurial Executive category in the Brazil Entrepreneur of the Year Program.



Pedro Wongtschowski, President of the Superior Council of Innovation and Competitiveness of Federation of Industries of the State of São Paulo - FIESP

Born in São Paulo (Brazil), he is a Chemical Engineer with a M.Sc. and Ph.D. from the University of São Paulo. He professionally worked at PROMON Engenharia (1972 -1977) as Project Manager. CEO of OXITENO (1992-2006), a major player in the chemical industry. He was CEO of ULTRAPAR, active in energy, infrastructure, and logistics (2007 – 2012).
